Our ground rules

In order to have a meaningful learning environment in which to operate, it is vital that <u>all</u> pupils should understand '**our ground rules**' particularly for this particular topic. As with everything at St. Osmund's, **respect** towards ourselves and others is expected in all we do and all we say. Further to this, when working in RSE lessons, all pupils need to understand these key points:

- Relationships and sex education is a <u>very</u> important, if not the <u>most</u> important, section of work in a child's schooling.
- RSE has to be taught by law in all schools in Britain.
- Pupils are encouraged to watch, listen and explore topics in a safe, caring and sensible environment.
- Everyone is encouraged to be 'open' and honest when speaking about aspects this subject.
- Everyone has the right to talk and ask questions without ridicule, embarrassment or pressure.
- Sex is <u>not</u> a 'dirty' word or topic, nor should it be something we are afraid to talk about.
- The member of staff leading any lesson has the right to not answer any question or topic they feel is <u>inappropriate</u> in a class situation. This may then be dealt with in a one-to-one situation at an appropriate time.
- These expectations will be explained and revisited in lessons, as needed.
