Natural resource	Something that is found in nature and can be used by people. Earth's natural

Mediterranean	Is very mild (few extreme temperatures), so it really on has 2 seasons: summer and
climate	winter. Summers are longer than winter, and the winter is very mild.
Grasslands (steppe)	Land on which the natural dominant plant forms are grasses and very few trees.
Hot deserts and	An arid biome that makes its home in places that receive very little rainfall
scrub	(precipitation) per year, averaging less then 10 inches of rainfall per year.
Rain shadow	A region having little rainfall because it is sheltered from prevailing rain-bearing
	winds by a range of hills.
Erosion	The gradual destruction of something by natural forces (such as water, wind, or ice)

They even call part of it the cradle of civilization. *The Middle East is also the origin point for many of the religions and belief systems which help define modern civilizations today. *The most populous countries in the Middle East include Pakistan (193 million), Egypt (90.6 million), Iran (79 million), and Turkey (78.7 million), while the least populated countries are Cyprus (1.1 million), Bahrain (1.4 million), Qatar (2.4 million), and Armenia (3 million).

*The Middle East is also called the Near East, especially when talking about history.

*18 separate countries make up this region: Bahrain, Cyprus, Egypt, Iran, Iraq, Israel, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Northern Cyprus, Oman, Palestine, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, Turkey, United Arab Emirates and Yemen.

*The most widely spoken languages in the Middle East are Arabic, Persian, Turkish, Berber and Kurdish.

*The largest cities in the Middle East are Cairo, Tehran, Istanbul, Baghdad, Riyadh, Jeddah and Ankara.

*The largest ethnic group in the Middle East are Arabs.

*Many countries in the Middle East are wealthy because they have large quantities of crude oil.
