


# VICTORIAN TILES

| Key Vocabulary |   |
|----------------|---|
| mosaic         | A pattern or image using small tiles  |
| design         | To create an idea   |
| monoprint      | A single print using lines or marks which can be made only once   |
| ghost print    | A print taken from the original acrylic sheet   |
| engrave        | To cut or carve into the surface of an object   |
| block print    | To print from a block with an engraved design. The block can be used multiple times to create a pattern |
| polyprint      | A polystyrene tile that can be engraved   |
| roller         | Used to roll ink  |
| acrylic sheet  | Used to roll ink onto   |
| consistency    | The thickness of the ink  |




## William Morris

1834-1896

William Morris was a British textile designer, and a leading artist in the Arts and Crafts Movement which revived traditional craft techniques. He was best known for his patterns on fabrics and wallpapers. His designs are influenced by nature. They include plants, flowers and birds.
